

English

This half term the children will be developing their technical writing across a traditional genre. Firstly, we will be looking at the legend, George and the Dragon inspired by the book by Christopher Wormwell. We will further develop our sentence structure, focusing on deepening the moment to add more detail to our writing. This will also be inspired by the film 'How to train your dragon'.

R.E.

This half term in R.E. we will be learning about Ceremonies. We will begin by understanding what a ceremony is and recognise religious ceremonies. We will learn about Passover, Ramadan and an Aqiqah.

Maths

In maths this half term we will be focusing on fractions. We will understand the difference between parts and the whole and identifying equal and unequal parts. We will recognise and find the fractions: $1/2$, $1/3$, $1/4$ and $3/4$. We'll do this using shapes and amounts. We will then recognise how $2/4$ and equal to $1/2$.

PSHE

In PSHE we will be learning about how to be the best versions of ourselves and how to stay determined. We also have health week, where we will be learning to stay safe and healthy in many different ways, including in the home and outside in the sun during our hot weather.

Science

This half term we will be revisiting and building on our knowledge of habitats and the plants and animals that live there. The children will make observations of a local habitat and creature that live there, investigate conditions in local microhabitats and how they affect the mini-beasts found within them. This half term the children will also learn about living things that are suited to their environment and the idea of dependency between plant and animal species.

Computing

In computing we will be using the software 'Microsoft Word' to practice adding text to a document. Children will learn how to use keyboard shortcuts and alter images.

Art

Children will create sculpture, using clay. We will use a range of sculpting and decorating techniques with clay, including making a clay tile. We will then apply these skills to create our clay houses.

PE

In PE we will be focusing on our throwing and catching skills. We will be looking at overarm and underarm throws. We will then move on and look at how to control the ball and then use these skills to play a fielding game.

History

The children will be looking at significant individuals from different times in the past and understanding why they're important. We will begin by comparing the lives of William Caxton and Tim Berners-Lee, from our previous learning. We will learn about Sir Isaac Newton and his inventions before moving on to the expeditions of Neil Armstrong and comparing his voyage to Christopher Columbus. We will also be learning more about Queen Victoria and her reign.
