Timetable - Mornings

Children enter school at 8:40 and will be registered by 9:00. During this time, they will work independently on thinking tasks or handwriting. Some children may complete a maths intervention.

Between 10:20 and 11:25, children will complete English with their class teacher.



Between 9:00 and 10:00, children will complete maths with Mr. Powell or Mr. Mills, dependent on their maths set. This is followed by a fifteen-minute break time.

Between 11:25 and 12:00, children will complete spelling and guided reading provision.



Timetable - Afternoons

- Afternoon sessions will begin at 13:10 and end at 15:30.
- Focus on wider curriculum subjects including history, geography, RE, PE, ICT, music, art, design technology and PSHE.
- Other elements will also feature, including: handwriting, comprehension, oracy and Oakham Learner Skills.
- No afternoon break
- No Golden Time



Timetable: Other Considerations

- Friday mornings follow a slightly different structure, with PE replacing spelling/guided reading.
- PE kits will always be needed in school on a Monday and a Friday.
- Computing Lessons will be on a Monday afternoon.
- Most interventions will take place during afternoon sessions and intervention groups will be decided by the third week of Autumn Term
- Music lessons will take place on a Thursday afternoon with Mr B Pye – an external tutor. Children will be given ukuleles to take home.

Home Learning

- Bug Club – children will have access to reading books at an appropriate level. There may be grammar games to complete as well.
- Reading – children will be issued with a home reading journal. They are expected to read three times weekly at home and hand their reading records in for stamping.
- Multiplication – children are encouraged to complete activities on TT Rockstars or Hit the Button.
- Projects – will be set termly and relate to history, geography or science.

Preparation

- Multiplication Tables – by the end of Y4, children will sit statutory multiplication checks up to 12×12 . Learning these tables with quick recall will be a huge benefit to understanding in maths.
- Handwriting – this will be done in school, but we follow the Nelson Handwriting Scheme. There are books available via the internet (Amazon) should anyone wish to purchase these for home.
- Tuck Shop will run each breaktime so if children wish to purchase light snacks such as toast, juice and fruit, a small amount of pocket money can be brought to school.
