

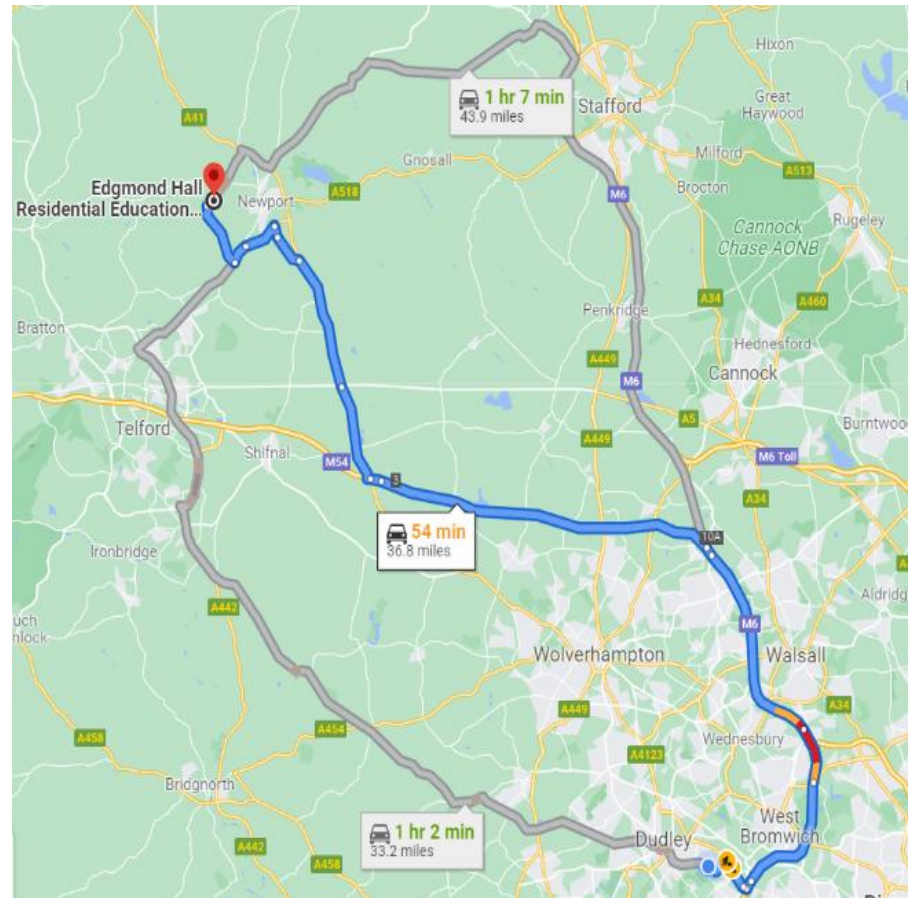

# Edgmond Hall – Key Info

- ▶ Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> July – Friday 10<sup>th</sup> July 2026
  - ▶ Cost £168.00 (standard fee) or £84.00 (Pupil Premium fee)
  - ▶ Initial deposit of £42 (PP = £21) due by **Monday 30th March 2026** (this is a non-refundable deposit and secures your child's place) The rest has been broken down in instalments which is detailed on the letter.
  - ▶ Final balance to be paid by Monday 29th June 2026.
  - ▶ All payments to be made via Parent Pay

Takes about an hour on the coach.




# Edgmond Hall

- ▶ Originally built in Georgian times as a farm.
- ▶ In 1936, Sandwell Council purchased the property.
- ▶ The Centre grounds are made up of forty-five acres of gardens, fields and woodlands

# Food

At Edgmond Hall, they offer a wide range of meals for the children to eat at breakfast, dinner, tea and supper.

## Breakfast

- ▶ Children have the option of a variety of different cereals, toast with the option of butter and a range of jams, and a selection of fruit. To drink, there is water, juice and milk.

## Lunch

- ▶ Children have filled sandwiches with the option of different fillings, such as: ham, cheese, tuna, egg mayonnaise and jam. The sandwiches are also accompanied with the crisps, yoghurts, option of salad, vegetable sticks and fruit.

## Tea

- ▶ For tea, children have a different cooked meal each day such as pizza, roast dinners, sausage and mash. There are also a variety of desserts served each day.

## Supper

- ▶ After our evening activity, children have the option of having hot chocolate and biscuits before bed.
- ▶ As well as at these allocated mealtimes, there are also drink breaks allocated throughout the day, in-between activities.

**Edgmond Hall will be informed of any dietary requirements or allergies that our children have and are very experienced in catering for a wide variety of needs.**



# Bedrooms


- ▶ Edgmond Hall has two separate floors for bedrooms – one for the boys and one for the girls.

- ▶ There is always a staff member from Edgmond Hall on duty each night too.

# Communication


For the duration of our time at Edgmond, we will be posting daily updates about what we have been up to, including some pictures of the children. The platform we will use will be communicated to you closer to the time.
